House Vote 1

H.F. 367: Ranked Choice Voting

Committee: Elections

Also known as instant run-off voting, ranked choice voting allows voters to rank candidates when they vote, rather than simply voting for their top choice. While proponents claim that this change is needed to avoid allowing any candidate to ever be elected with less than 50 percent of the vote, MCCL does not believe that this is a problem that needs to be addressed. MCCL opposes ranked choice voting. H.F. 367, authored by Rep. Steve Simon, DFL-Hopkins, would allow for expansion of ranked choice voting in local elections. MCCL opposed H.F. 367, which passed out of committee 7-2 (pro-life loss).

House Vote 2

H.F. 1944: Electioneering Communications

Committee: Elections

- H.F. 1944, authored by Rep. Ryan Winkler, DFL-Golden Valley, was a campaign finance bill that contained several provisions. Included in this complicated bill were three main provisions, each of which was of concern to MCCL:
- 1) "Express advocacy" definition change: The bill sought to expand the definition of express advocacy. Currently, express advocacy has a clear legal definition in Minnesota. The change would have created a subjective definition, allowing the Campaign Finance and Campaign Disclosure Board to decide which expenditures fit within the definition.
- 2) Underlying source disclosure: This provision would have changed the way that reporting entities would allocate donations subject to public disclosure. Because the new allocation method would be based on a ratio of expenditures to donations (numbers which change on a daily basis), it would make reporting extremely complex and difficult to do accurately.
- 3) Electioneering communications: This provision declares many non-election communications as "electioneering communications" merely because they are disseminated within a specified time frame prior to an election. It additionally places cumbersome and chilling reporting requirements on these communications. This is the provision to which MCCL most strongly objected.

MCCL strongly opposed H.F. 1944, which passed out of committee 7-4 (pro-life loss).

House Vote 3

Taxpayer Funded Abortion

Floor: Amendment

Rep. Patti Fritz, DFL-Faribault, had introduced a bill to ban taxpayer funded abortion (H.F. 901), but it was never granted a hearing. In order to move the legislation forward, Rep. Fritz offered it as an amendment to a supplemental budget bill, H.F. 3172. MCCL supported the Fritz amendment, which passed 69-61 (pro-life win).

House Vote 4

Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

Floor: Amendment

Rep. Mary Liz Holberg, R-Lakeville, had carried legislation in 2011 (though it was ultimately vetoed by Gov. Mark Dayton) to prohibit abortion in cases where the unborn child was developed to the point of being capable of feeling pain, estimated at 20 weeks after conception. Rep. Holberg re-introduced the legislation in 2014 (H.F. 2927), though it never received a hearing. Attempting to move the legislation forward, she offered the language as an amendment to the supplemental budget bill, H.F. 3172. The amendment passed 70-60 (pro-life win).
