

2015 Legislative Accountability Rating

2015 House Votes

House Vote 1

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Reform (Amendment)

Authored by Rep. Deb Kiel, R-Crookston, H.F. 606 seeks to require Minnesota's abortion facilities to be licensed by the state and made subject to routine inspections. Rep. Sandra Masin, DFL-Eagan, offered an amendment to inappropriately change the licensure requirements sought under the proposal. MCCL opposed the Masin amendment, which was defeated 9-12 (pro-life win).

House Vote 2

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Reform (Amendment)

Rep. Joe Mullery, DFL-Minneapolis, offered an amendment which would have provided grant funds to help abortion facilities get up to code on any new requirements due to licensure. MCCL opposed the Mullery amendment, which was defeated 9-12 (pro-life win).

House Vote 3

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Reform

Following the defeat of the Mullery amendment and further discussion of the bill, a motion was made to re-refer H.F. 606 to the next committee. The motion passed 12-9 (pro-life win).

House Vote 4

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Government Operations and Election Policy

The next stop for H.F. 606 saw further discussion of the bill, though no amendments were offered. The bill was re-referred to the Health and Human Services Finance committee by a vote of 9-6 (pro-life win).

House Vote 5

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance (Amendment)

In this committee, Rep. Diane Loeffler, DFL-Minneapolis, offered an amendment virtually identical to the amendment offered in House Vote 2. Because MCCL believes that it is the responsibility of an abortion facility, not the state, to ensure its facility is up to code, MCCL again opposed the amendment. The Loeffler amendment failed 7-10 (pro-life win).

House Vote 6

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance (Amendment)

Next, Rep. Laurie Halverson, DFL-Eagan, offered an amendment that was virtually identical to the amendment offered in House Vote 1. Again, MCCL opposed the amendment, which failed 7-10 (pro-life win).

House Vote 7

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance (Procedural)

In an effort to slow down progress of the bill, Rep. Dan Schoen, DFL-Cottage Grove, moved to change the re-referral from Ways & Means to the Public Safety committee. MCCL opposed the motion to change the referral, which was defeated 7-10 (pro-life win).

House Vote 8

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance (Procedural)

Still trying to stall the bill, Rep. Schoen next moved to change the re-referral from Ways & Means to the Civil Law and Data Practices committee. Again, MCCL opposed the motion to change the referral, which was defeated 7-10 (pro-life win).

House Vote 9

H.F. 606: Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance

Finally, a vote was taken on the original motion to re-refer the bill to the committee on Ways & Means. With MCCL's strong support, the motion passed 10-7 (pro-life win).

House Vote 10

S.F. 1458: HHS omnibus bill

Floor:Amendment (Licensing and Inspection of Abortion Facilities)

Eventually, H.F. 606 passed out of its last committee, Ways & Means, and was placed on the General Register. However, because the bill would be difficult to pass in the Senate as a stand-alone bill, the House opted to pass the language as an amendment to the Health and Human Services omnibus bill, S.F. 1458, instead of on its own. This would ensure that the language would make it to a conference committee and give it a chance to be included in the final bill. Rep. Kiel offered the amendment, which passed 76-57 (pro-life win). Unfortunately, the language was not included in the conference committee report.

House Vote 11

H.F. 607: Ban on taxpayer funding of abortion

Committee: Health and Human Services Reform

H.F. 607, a bill to restore a ban on taxpayer funded abortion, was authored by Rep. Tama Theis, R-St. Cloud. Though there was plenty of discussion, there were no amendments offered in the first committee, and it was re-referred to the Health and Human Services Finance committee by a vote of 12-8 (pro-life win).

House Vote 12

H.F. 607: Ban on taxpayer funding of abortion

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance (Procedural)

In its final committee stop, an opponent of the bill, Rep. Halverson, made a motion to send H.F. 607 to the Commerce committee. Because there was no reason for the bill to be heard in that committee, MCCL opposed this delaying motion, which failed 7-10 (pro-life win).

House Vote 13

H.F. 607: Ban on taxpayer funding of abortion

Committee: Health and Human Services Finance

Following Rep. Halverson's unsuccessful attempt to re-refer the bill, H.F. 607 was sent to the General Register by a vote of 10-7 (pro-life win).

House Vote 14

S.F. 1458: HHS omnibus bill

Floor:Amendment (Ban on taxpayer funding of abortion)

Like the bill to require licensure and inspection of abortion facilities, the ban on taxpayer funded abortion faced an uphill climb in the Senate. Thus, the language was offered as an amendment to S.F. 1458, the Health and Human Services (HHS) omnibus finance bill, by Rep. Theis. The amendment passed 76-57 (pro-life win).

NOTE: While neither the language to require licensing and inspection of abortion facilities nor the language to prohibit taxpayer funded abortions was included in the final version of the HHS omnibus bill, other pro-life provisions that didn't receive any roll call votes in the 2015 legislative session were included and signed into law. The provisions that became law included funding to raise awareness of the Safe Place for Newborns law (H.F. 825, Rep. Roz Peterson, R-Lakeville), updates to Minnesota's

Born Alive Infant Protection Act (H.F. 1047, Rep. Abigail Whelan, R-Anoka) and additional funding for the Positive Alternatives grant program (no bill, Rep. Matt Dean, R-Dellwood).

House Vote 15

H.F. 43: Electioneering Communications

Committee: Government Operations and Election Policy

H.F. 43, authored by Rep. Ryan Winkler, DFL-Golden Valley, was a campaign finance bill similar to past bills. Included in this complicated bill were two main provisions of concern to MCCL:

1) “Express advocacy” definition change: The bill sought to expand the definition of express advocacy. Currently, express advocacy has a clear legal definition in Minnesota. The change would have created a subjective definition, allowing the Campaign Finance and Campaign Disclosure Board to decide which expenditures fit within the definition.

2) Electioneering communications: This provision declares many non-election communications as “electioneering communications” merely because they are disseminated within a specified timeframe prior to an election. It additionally places cumbersome and chilling reporting requirements on these communications. This is the provision that MCCL most strongly objected to.

MCCL strongly opposed H.F. 43, which was rejected by the committee 6-8 (pro-life win).

House Vote 16

S.F. 888: Elections omnibus bill

Floor: Amendment (Electioneering Communications) (Procedural)

S.F. 888, the omnibus elections bill, contained a number of provisions, but none that were of significant interest to MCCL. However, when the bill was before the House of Representatives, Rep. Winkler offered an amendment that contained the most troublesome provisions of the electioneering communications legislation (see vote 15). Because the legislation was shown to have an impact on the budget but there was no accounting of that in the amendment, Rep. Tim O’Driscoll, R-Sartell, raised a point of order that the Winkler amendment was out of order. The Speaker agreed, and he ruled the amendment out of order. Rep. Winkler then appealed the decision of the Speaker. MCCL supported the decision of the Speaker, which was upheld 76-53 (pro-life win).

House Vote 17

S.F. 888: Elections omnibus bill

Floor: Amendment (Electioneering Communications)

Following the loss of the amendment in Vote 16, Rep. Winkler offered another amendment. This amendment was a simplified version of the same concept. Because the new language would continue to have the same chilling effect on MCCL’s ability to engage in grassroots advocacy, MCCL opposed the new Winkler amendment. The amendment was defeated 51-78 (pro-life win).

Percentage of time the legislator voted “with” MCCL when he/she voted. In this case, the “e” or “n” vote is not counted.
