Senate Vote 1

Woman's Right to Know law

Floor: Amendment

In 2003, MCCL was instrumental in passing the Woman's Right to Know law in Minnesota. The law requires that women considering an abortion be told the gestational age of their unborn child, the risks of the abortion procedure and of carrying the child to term, and the medical, child support, and other assistance available to them. It also requires that women be offered additional information about the unborn child's development, alternatives to abortion, and more. The law empowers women by ensuring informed consent prior to abortion.

On April 16, 2021, Sen. Lindsey Port (DFL-Burnsville) offered an amendment to repeal the Woman's Right to Know law when H.F. 2128, the Health and Human Services Omnibus Finance bill, was being considered on the floor of the Senate. Sen. Port's amendment would have eliminated from law the right of women to be offered this information before an abortion. MCCL opposed the amendment. The amendment was defeated 30-36 (a pro-life victory), and pro-life votes to keep the Woman's Right to Know law are represented below with an x.
